I do not maintain records of fellow participants or committee members, or employees of organizations or events, as these will not, by themselves, "*from a reasonable third person's point of view having knowledge of the relevant facts, give rise to justifiable doubts as to the arbitrator's impartiality or independence....*"

Any party in an arbitration, for which I am proposed as an arbitrator, is requested to disclose promptly any circumstances leading that party to question my impartiality or independence as soon as that information is reasonably available to that party. For that purpose, I ask that party questioning my impartiality or independence to undertake a reasonable search of publicly available information promptly after learning of my being proposed as an arbitrator.
